There ought to be things we should like to do and cannot do because our charitable expenditure excludes them."

Jesus personified sacrifice. We honor his sacrifice by giving sacrificially in his name. When we do so, we are filled with joy stemming from better alignment with God's purpose for our lives or, in other words, from living like Jesus.
