DAY 29: SURRENDERING THE DESIRE FOR CONTROL OVER OTHERS

Scripture: Matthew 20:25-28 "But Jesus called them together and said, 'You know that the rulers in this world lord it over their people, and officials flaunt their authority over those under them. But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must become your slave."

Question: How can surrendering the desire for control align with Christ-like servanthood?

Question: How can surrendering the need for immediate answers deepen your reliance on God's wisdom?

All that I am and all that I possess, Thou hast given me: I surrender it all to Thee to be disposed of according to Thy will. 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DAY 32: SURRENDERING THE PURSUIT OF RECOGNITION

Scripture: Matthew 6:1 "Be careful not to practice your righteousness in front of others to be seen by them. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father in heaven."

Question: How can surrendering the pursuit of recognition redirect your focus on serving God authentically?

DAY 33: SURRENDERING THE URGE TO JUDGE OTHERS

Scripture: Romans 14:10 "You, then, why do you judge your brother or sister? Or why do you treat them with contempt? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat."

Question: How can surrendering the urge to judge others foster empathy and understanding?

Theological Quote: "We surrender the supremacy of our ego, our self-centered demands for power, pleasure, prestige, prominence. We surrender the supremacy of our group, whether that group is defined by religion, race, politics, nationality, economic class, social status, or whatever. We even surrender the supremacy of our species, realizing that humans can't survive and thrive unless the plankton and trees, the soil and bees, and the climate and seas thrive too. We gladly shed supremacy to make room for solidarity. That gain, we discover is worth every cost." - Brian MacClaren

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DAY 34: SURRENDERING THE IDOL OF SELF-SUFFICIENCY

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 3:5 "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God."

Question: How can surrendering self-sufficiency deepen your reliance on God's strength?

Theological Quote: "God can do more with your surrender than you can do with your control." - Craig Groschel

DAY 35: SURRENDERING THE DESIRE FOR CONTROL

Scripture: Proverbs 19:21 "Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails."

Question: How can surrendering the desire for control bring peace in trusting God's plan?

Theological Quote: "...when we first up the ante in the spiritual journey there's this sense of this incredible *heaviness* – this thing, this stuff, this loneliness, this emptiness, this ache, this whatever it is – is in your face. It's heavy. You feel it as something odd and unfamiliar and even alien. And as you gradually get used to it, it lightens. But the knack – and this is what you really practice going through the dark night of the sense and developing this surrender, surrender, surrender thing is that surrender will always get you where you're going – and if you can surrender into being gentle and quiet with it rather than resisting and pulling out it will pass, it will move." - Cynthia Bourgealt

DAY 36: SURRENDERING THE URGE FOR IMMEDIATE GRATIFICATION

Scripture: Hebrews 12:11 "No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it."

Question: How can surrendering the urge for immediate gratification lead to greater spiritual growth?

Theological Quote: "Powerlessness is our greatest treasure. Don't try to get rid of it. Everything in us wants to get rid of it. Grace is sufficient for you, but not something you can understand. To be in too big a hurry to get over our difficulties is a mistake because you don't know how valuable they are from God's perspective, for without them you might never be transformed as deeply and as thoroughly. We cannot know love if we remain unable to surrender our attachment to power, if any feeling of vulnerability strikes terror in our hearts." - Bell Hooks

DAY 37: PALM SUNDAY

Scripture: Matthew 21:1-11 (The Triumphal Entry)

"The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted, 'Hosanna to the Son of David!' 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!' 'Hosanna in the highest heaven!' When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, 'Who is this?' The crowds answered, 'This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.'"

Reflection: Palm Sunday is a day of paradox. It marks Jesus 'triumphal entry into Jerusalem, hailed as a king by the crowds. Yet, woven into this celebration is the poignant awareness of what lies ahead—His surrender to God's will even unto death. The scene is filled with shouts of "Hosanna!" meaning "save us," yet it foreshadows the surrender of Jesus, the ultimate Savior, for the redemption of all.

In the midst of this jubilation, Jesus surrenders His status, His comfort, and ultimately, His life. He enters not on a warhorse as a conqueror, but on a humble donkey, embodying a message of peace and humility.

Prayer: Gracious God, on this Palm Sunday, help us to embrace the paradox of surrender. Like the crowd that welcomed Jesus, may we also lay our hopes, our triumphs, and our desires at Your feet. Teach us the depth of surrender, understanding that true victory often comes through letting go. As we enter Holy Week, grant us the courage to surrender our will to Yours, knowing that in surrendering, we find the greatest fulfillment of Your purpose for our lives. Amen.

Application: Consider areas in your life where surrender might lead to a deeper connection with God. Reflect on what it means to welcome Christ not just as a triumphant king but as the One who invites us to surrender our lives to Him.

DAY 38: SURRENDERING IN THE WAITING

Scripture: Matthew 26:36-39 (Jesus in Gethsemane)

"Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.' He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them, 'My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep watch with me.' Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed, 'My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will.'"

Reflection: In the garden, Jesus faces the anguish of surrender. Knowing the weight of what lay ahead, He pours out His heart to the Father, acknowledging His deep distress. Yet, in this moment, He models the essence of surrender—not my will, but Yours be done. Jesus, in His humanity, grapples with the impending sacrifice but surrenders to God's greater purpose.

DAY 39: HOLY TUESDAY: SURRENDERING TO AUTHORITY

Scripture: Matthew 21:23-27 (Jesus' Authority Questioned)

"Jesus entered the temple courts, and, while he was teaching, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to him. 'By what authority are you doing these things?' they asked. 'And who gave you this authority?'"

Reflection: In facing the challenge to His authority, Jesus demonstrates surrender by acknowledging His ultimate submission to the will of the Father. His authority was not a display of dominance but a surrender to the divine purpose entrusted to Him.

Quote: "Christ's surrender to authority was not weakness but the epitome of strength and submission to God's will." - Dietrich Bonhoeffer

DAY 40: HOLY WEDNESDAY: SURRENDERING TO THE CROSS

Scripture: Philippians 2:8 (Christ's Obedience unto Death)

"And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross!"

Reflection: The cross stands as the ultimate symbol of surrender. Jesus willingly accepts the path of suffering and sacrifice, showcasing obedience to the Father's will for the redemption of humanity. His surrender on the cross becomes the doorway to our salvation.

Quote: "The cross stands as a powerful reminder that surrender to God's will brings forth the greatest victory." - N.T. Wright

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HOLY THURSDAY: SURRENDERING IN SERVANTHOOD

Scripture: John 13:3-5, 12-15 (Jesus Washes His Disciples' Feet)

"Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under his power, and that he had come from God and was returning to God; so he got up from the meal, took off his outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around his waist. After that, he poured water into a basin and began to wash his disciples 'feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around him... When he had finished washing their feet, he put on his clothes and returned to his place. 'Do you understand what I have done for you?' he asked them. 'You call me 'Teacher' and 'Lord,' and rightly so, for that is what I am. Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.'"

Reflection: In the act of washing His disciples' feet, Jesus embodies surrender in servanthood. He, the Lord and Teacher, humbles Himself to serve, demonstrating the essence of surrender by setting an example of selfless love and service.

Quote: "True surrender is often found in the humblest acts of service, echoing Christ's example of selfless love." - Brennan Manning

GOOD FRIDAY: SURRENDERING ON THE CROSS

Scripture: Luke 23:46 (Jesus' Last Words)

"Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' When he had said this, he breathed his last."

Reflection: At the crucifixion, Jesus reaches the pinnacle of surrender. His final words reflect complete trust and surrender into the Father's hands, even in the midst of excruciating suffering. The cross becomes the ultimate testament to His surrender for the salvation of humanity.

Quote: "The cross embodies the ultimate surrender, where Jesus entrusts His spirit to the Father, offering redemption to all." - Jürgen Moltmann

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EASTER VIGIL SATURDAY: WAITING IN HOPE

Scripture: Romans 8:18-25 (Waiting in Hope)

"I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us. For the creation waits in eager expectation for the children of God to be revealed. For the creation was subjected to frustration, not by its own choice, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be liberated from its bondage to decay and brought into the freedom and glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time. Not only so, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for our adoption to sonship, the redemption of our bodies. For in this hope we were saved. But hope that is seen is no hope at all. Who hopes for what they already have? But if we hope for what we do not yet have, we wait for it patiently."

Reflection: Easter Vigil Saturday is a time of waiting and hopeful anticipation. This passage reminds us that even in the midst of suffering and bondage, there is a hope—a hope for liberation and freedom that comes through Christ's resurrection. It's a time of eager expectation for the chains of sin and decay to be broken.

EASTER SUNDAY: RELEASED FROM CHAINS

Scripture: Isaiah 61:1-3 (The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord)

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is on me, because the Lord has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn, and provide for those who grieve in Zion—to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the Lord for the display of his splendor."

Reflection: Easter Sunday celebrates the glorious release from chains—the chains of sin, despair, and death. Through Christ's resurrection, the prophecy in Isaiah finds fulfillment. Jesus breaks the chains that bind us, offering freedom, joy, and restoration.
