
QUESTION #1


Action: Complete the Genderbread Person worksheet and share with a close friend or family member.

QUESTION #2 What do queer people need from the church?


Hope: For you to be open to reframing your questions, moving from saving queer people to learning from queer people.

Action: Choose either the Kegler or Gushee book (or both!), and read the Preface (it's free!) on goodreads.com.


Reflection: What is something new you learned about reading Scripture?
