

"It started raining and it started snowing at the same time, that mix. We flew off this highway going 70 miles an hour. The car rolled two and a half times and ended up on its side. We were lucky to be alive."

The lead singer of the band, The Lumineers, shared these words at a recent concert to describe a car accident that spun the singer and his then girlfriend into a panicked whirlwind. When they stopped spinning they weren't sure where they were or what was next. They were just lucky to be alive.

In my teen years I was a pretty reckless driver and I narrowly escaped many accidents, but one time I did hit the guardrail and spun out of control on a highway facing the opposite direction of traffic. It was hard to know how to get out of the mess and quite frankly, I was disoriented, a little banged up and full of fear.

It has all been disorienting, for sure, but now that the spinning has stopped or come to a relative slow, we have control over where we will orient the car next. Do we head in the same direction we were going before or is this our chance to hit "reset" and program our internal compass to follow a new path?

It is human nature to think that reorientation is as easy as typing in a new address in the map application, but if you strip away the technological gps centered devices and you think back to the original map, even before paper topography, you can remember the power of the rudimentary, but never failing, compass.

You know that unwavering red arrow on the simple orienteering tool. It always points north and it doesn't point north on the basis of its own decision making. It points north because there is a magnetic pull within that determines where it longs to go and no matter how many times you try to get the red arrow to go in another direction, it will always follow the magnetic pull of its design.

Whether we are aware of it or not, we have a magnetic pull in us that knows the right way to go. Sometimes it's hard to hear or feel or know, but it is always there, our true north.

This fall at TMPC we would like to offer a Reset. Three weeks in September to get back on track, to make a decision about where to direct your time and your heart and to reorient your life to your true north, Jesus Christ. Inside this newsletter you will see some of the incredible work that our church has done in what is usually an "off" season and you will see many invitations to join in the ministry that is not disorienting, but re-orienting and we will write this new song together.



Summer Reflections



In August, Bill Stauffer and Olivia Kouversas attended a weeklong conference at Princeton Theological Seminary with renowned theologians and professors to dream and brainstorm about young adult ministry in our church and community. We celebrate our continuing connections at PTS and look forward to what will come out of this experience. Olivia took some time to share about her week:

The conference held at Princeton Seminary was an amazing experience. Sitting in a room filled with theologians, authors, professors, and other young adults to just talk about God, love, and all things religious or spiritual offered the chance to hear and be a part of amazing conversations. One of the best parts of these conversations was the fact that they also happened outside of the discussion time. A personal favorite memory was getting to talk to people over dinner about topics ranging from using art to convey messages about God and love to how science can connect with the spiritual. We were the last ones to leave the restaurant, but I barely noticed that as we sat and talked for hours. It truly was eye-opening, and I still find myself thinking back to questions that were raised for me in that conversation. I found myself leaving this conference with a newfound confidence in my exploration of faith and God. I found that questions still arose for people who had researched this for decades as well as myself- even though they certainly had more experience than me. However, that lack of experience didn't feel like something that would hold me back but instead feed my curiosity to know more. That worry turned into a realization that my journey had only begun and questions and unknowing were normal. Even among the most experienced and educated, there is no one way to define God because we don't have all of the words for something as big as that. I hope to continue this exploration that began at the conference as a way to not only deepen my own faith but others around me as well as we continue to engage in more amazing conversations.

Bible Presentation


