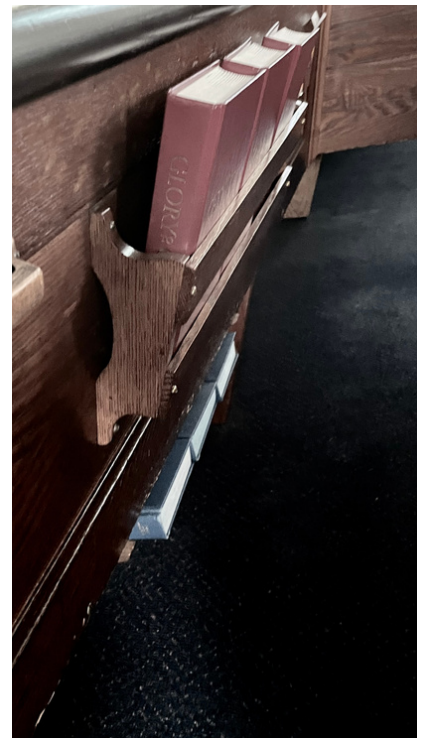
A few years ago we were visiting family in Iceland and my brother decided to take an adventure trip into the belly of a dormant volcano. The experience was expensive and our children were too young so we wished him well as he was lowered into the mouth of the volcano by rope.

Though the volcano had not erupted in a very long time, we were all a little nervous about what this experience might entail.

Several weeks ago when I learned the news of a local woman who shot her children in our neighborhood, I clearly remember being on the phone with a friend and I instinctively blurted out, "I'm honestly not surprised. We all have a volcano waiting to erupt in each one of us."

The last few years have been so hard and the lava has been boiling. It just takes one more shift of the plates and the eruption is inevitable.

When tragedy strikes, we are quick to condemn and even quicker to separate ourselves from the person who did something terrible. Demonization is easy.

What is harder is naming the volcano that is in each of us. The things that make us boil and erupt. The unsteadiness beneath our feet lets the lava creep up like indigestion. Sometimes it comes out in sharp remarks or erratic driving, but sometimes it comes out in more horrific ways that cause a lifetime worth of regret.

I think it's fair to say that we all have some degree of boiling lava and it's absolutely true that we all have had our footing destabilized; the plates have shifted. But what if we allowed what is in us to erupt for each other and not at each other.

“*What if we allow what is boiling in us to erupt for each other instead of at each other?*”

What if we used all the pain and all the grief and all of the sadness that we are all experiencing and we used it to fight for what we believe in?

What if we fought for sacred space in our lives as resistance to complacency?

What if we fought for the poor and marginalized as a resistance to the consumer culture that envelopes us?

What if we fought for love?

I am always the person who looks for the silver lining and the shining star in the midst of every tragedy.

Perhaps it's simple or delusional. For me, it is an expression of my faith, that God will always make a way and that God can redeem it all.

At a conference this week, the keynote speaker, Kate Bowler, was asked to contrast and compare hope with toxic positivity. She defined toxic positivity as the unhelpful way of saying that everything will be great while watching the house burn down, but hope is the strong and a sure rope that we cling to as God pulls us forward, a deep knowing that there is a future and it is God's.

After what seemed like an incredibly long time in the belly of the volcano, my brother was drawn back up and out by the guides who watched for his safety. He had seen the remnants of destruction and collapse, the after-effects of molten lava, and the signs of repeated eruptions. And he saw it as incredible.

We stood outside in the remnants of the volcano, surrounded by dark gray earth, black dirt, and solidified lava, and there, among the destruction, a fern grew. It's bright green a persistent testimony to new life in the middle of despair.

These are painful days. Hold on. A fern is growing.

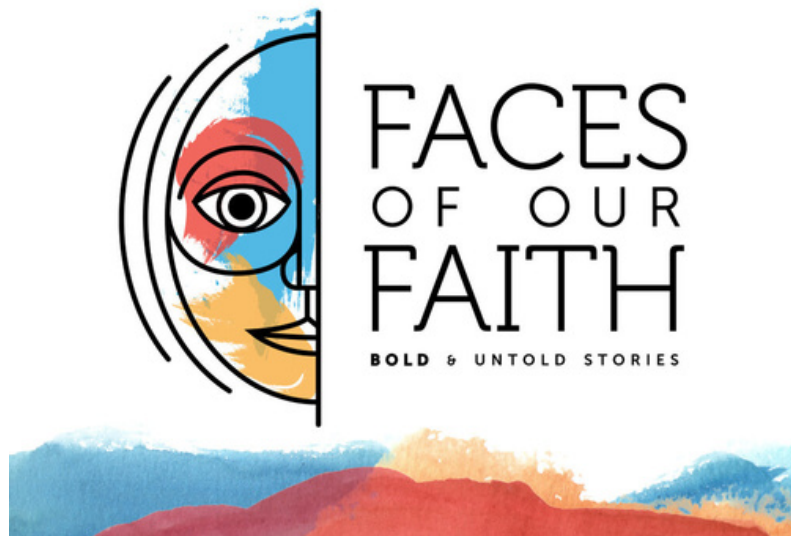

Let us remember that everyone is part of God's kingdom. Each person should be celebrated and encouraged to seek the peace that only God can provide.

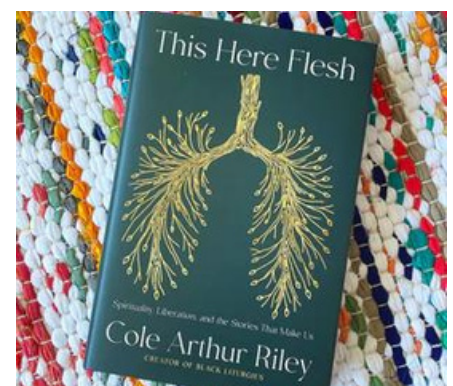


Summer Reading
