
In Psalm 51, God tells us that it's time to clean house.

Author Ruth Haley Barton says: "The real question of the Lenten season is how will I clear out the junk and garbage in my life so that I can be restored to God in some fresh way? What are the disciplines that will open up space for God to create a clean heart and new spirit in me?"

God's way of housekeeping comes through the process of acknowledging and letting go. God's way of housekeeping comes through asking for forgiveness and accepting grace.

The best thing after a deep clean is the satisfaction of opening the fridge door and enjoying the order and peace that comes from knowing things are in their right place.



How will I clear out the junk in my life so that I can be restored to God in some fresh way?

Let's use this lenten season to re-order our lives around what matters most.Let's use this lenten season to grow closer in small groups, to engage in forgiving acts, and to commit to worship (there are 8 Sundays between the first Sunday and Lent and Easter -- can you commit to 8 for 8?, online, in person, or watching what you missed before bed on Sunday evening?) 

Dive Deep Into Lent


During the season of lent, we have three great opportunities for you and your families to grow outside of Sunday worship.

Thompson offers many activities to keep our children engaged with many opportunities to grow in their faith and experience God's love through lessons, games, mission, and more!


One Great Hour of Sharing
